*Anti-Smoking Jenny Ramos Gagne' and Putnam County SWAT Students.*

*Jenny Ramos introduced the youth.*

*The youth of Putnam County presented an anti-smoking campaign to keep smoking out of  
playgrounds, parks, to protect the children from smoke. The students have asked for smoking and  
vaping to be taken out of the parks.*

*Doris Carol has asked if an ordinance can be put into place in the town.*

*Jenny Ramos explained that currently in Putnam County there is no ordinances against smoking  
in parks.*

***Councilman Swanson motioned to move forward to draft a model ordinance and

**ORDINANCE NO. 2025-01**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF POMONA PARK, FLORIDA, AMENDING ARTICLE II, CHAPTER 34 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES ADDING A NEW SECTION 34-9 PROHIBITING SMOKING OR VAPING, IN MUNICIPAL PARKS OR MUNICIPALLY CONTROLLED BEACHES AND BEACH PARKS; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, REPEAL, CODIFICATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE**

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 386.209, *Florida Statutes*, provides that the regulation of smoking is preempted to the State of Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, the youth in communities throughout Florida currently play on playgrounds, athletic fields, aquatic facilities, and other recreation facilities with inconsiderate smokers around the children providing them unhealthy secondhand smoke; and

**WHEREAS**, according to a 2020 report published by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, the Surgeon General has found that tobacco smoke is the leading cause of preventable disease, disability, and death in the United States. The Surgeon General has also previously found that tobacco smoke contains over 7,000 chemicals, including hundreds that are toxic and up to 69 that are known to cause cancer and exposure to secondhand smoke can cause numerous health problems and has been linked to cancer and other fatal diseases; and

**WHEREAS**, HB 105 and SB 224 were filed in the Florida Legislature for the 2022 Legislative Session, to allow local governments to protect the youth of their community by designating smoke-free zones or designated smoking areas within a municipality or county; and

**WHEREAS**, the staff analysis published for HB 105 references various studies from United Health Foundation, America’s Health Rankings, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (“CDC”), and others on the impact that smoking has on the health of citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, the reports referenced in the staff analysis for HB 105 further states that secondhand smoke is generally defined as smoke from burning tobacco products or smoke that is exhaled by a tobacco smoker. Exposure to secondhand smoke can cause numerous health problems and has been causally linked to cancer and other fatal diseases. Studies suggest that secondhand smoke in crowded outdoor areas can cause concentrations of air contaminants comparable to those caused by indoor smoking; and

**WHEREAS**, the CDC states that secondhand smoke is generally defined as smoke from burning tobacco products or smoke that is exhaled by a tobacco smoker; and

**WHEREAS**, HB 105, as amended, passed the Florida Legislature on March 2, 2022, and was later signed into law by the Governor on June 24, 2022; and



WHEREAS, HB 105 became effective law on July 1, 2022, and the Town Council of Pomona Park, Florida (the “Town Council”), has determined a public health and safety need to establish designated smoke-free zones within the municipal parks and municipal beach of Pomona Park; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of Pomona Park finds and declares that the adoption of this Ordinance is appropriate, and in the public interest of this community.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUCNIL OF POMONA PARK , FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1: Recitals**

The above recitals are true and correct and are hereby incorporated by reference.

**Section 2: Effective Date**

This Ordinance shall become effective upon final approval by the Town Council.

**Section 3: Amendment**

That Section 34-9 of Article I of Chapter 34 is hereby added to the Code of Ordinances of Pomona Park, Florida, and reads as follows:

**Sec. 34-9. – Adoption of Designated smoke-free zones within Municipal Parks and Municipal Beach Parks.**

**The Town Council hereby adopts regulations prohibiting smoking or vaping, in municipal parks and municipal beach parks and as exempted by the Florida Legislature (unfiltered cigars), as authorized by Florida Law, HB 105, adopted in the 2022 Legislative Session and codified in Chapter 2022-213, Laws of Florida.**

**The Town Council may adopt and amend as necessary, by resolution, specific designated smoking areas in each municipal park and the municipal beach park within the Town as authorized by Chapter 2022-213, Laws of Florida.**

**Section 4: Severability and Conflict**

If any portion of this Ordinance is declared by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, such declaration shall not be deemed to affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 5: Inclusion in the Code of Ordinances and Land Development Regulations**

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be included and incorporated into the Code of Ordinances and Land Development Regulations of the Town of Pomona Park, Florida, as an addition or amendment thereto, and shall be appropriately renumbered to conform to the uniform numbering system of the code.

**Section 6: Effective Date**

This Ordinance shall become effective upon its final adoption by the Town of Pomona Park Town Council

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**Business Impact Estimate**

This Business Impact Statement concerns a proposed ordinance of the Town of Pomona Park, Florida, the title of which is as follows:

- e. Section 633.202, Florida Statutes, relating to the Florida Fire Prevention Code.

### **Business Impact Estimate**

The Town provides the following Business Impact Estimate, which may be revised following its initial posting:

The purpose of the ordinance is to remove smoking in municipal parks, in response to the growing issue of smoking device litter on land and in waterways, which is beneficial to the environment and human health.

2. An estimate of the direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, for-profit businesses in the town, if any:

(a) An estimate of direct compliance costs that businesses may reasonably incur,

Businesses will not be directly economically impacted by this proposed ordinance.

**Resolution No. 2025-02**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF POMONA PARK TOWN COUNCIL OF POMONA PARK, FLORIDA, URGING THE FLORIDA STATE LEGISLATURE TO ENACT LEGISLATION TO PROVIDE A PUBLIC RECORDS EXEMPTION FOR MUNICIPAL CLERKS AND EMPLOYEES WHO PERFORM MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS WORK OR HAVE ANY PART IN CODE ENFORCEMENT FUNCTIONS OF THE TOWN AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**Whereas**, many municipal staff who perform duties that include, or result in, investigations into complaints regarding election fraud, legal enforcement of hearings that could lead to a criminal prosecution or code enforcement actions are exposed to threats and other acts of violence; and

**Whereas**, municipal clerks often administer elections and some election workers have been targeted for threats and violence due to the nature of materials they are responsible for

**Whereas**, municipal clerks are often involved in legal enforcement proceedings in actions related to violations of codes and ordinances and, occasionally, these proceedings have led to retaliation and threats by defendants; and

**Whereas**, currently public records exemptions in Florida include those for local personnel who either investigate, enforce or otherwise provide a service that can result in contentious interactions when action is taken and municipal clerks and their staffs fall within the need for a window for greater protection; and

**Whereas**, the Florida Association of City Clerks is very concerned for the safety and well-being of the municipal clerks and their staffs who serve the public on a daily basis and are, oftentimes, the first contact of citizens with cities; and

**Whereas**, the Town of Pomona Park has complied with all requirements and procedures of Florida law in processing and adopting this Resolution.

**WHEREAS**, it serves a municipal purpose and Council is authorized pursuant to its Home Rule Powers to adopt a code of ethics and conduct.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF POMONA PARK, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1. Adoption.** The Town Council hereby adopts the Town of Pomona Park Code of Ethics and Conduct for Elected and Appointed Officials. A complete copy is on file with the Town Clerk.

**SECTION 2. Conflicts.** All ordinances, resolutions or parts of ordinances or resolutions in conflict with any of the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 3. Severability.** If any Section or portion of a Section of this Resolution proves to be invalid, unlawful, or unconstitutional, it shall not be held to invalidate or impair the validity, force, or effect of any other Section or part of this Resolution.

**SECTION 4. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.

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On February 27, 2025, I responded to 1775 South Highway 17, Pomona Park, 32181 in reference to a "Hit and Run" traffic crash. I spoke to Jennifer Paul, a staff member of the City of Pomona Park, who advised someone had crashed into the fire hydrant at 1738 South Highway 17. This caused the hydrant to pour water profusely. Prior to my arrival, city officials were able to disable the hydrant. Jennifer advised the fire hydrant will cost about \$8,000.00 to replace.

Jennifer advised the crash occurred at approximately 1:06pm and she was informed a tan golf cart driving on the sidewalk struck the hydrant and left the scene. Through my investigation, I spoke to several businesses. While I was not able to gain video of the crash, I was informed by staff of the Whistle Stop a male in a tan golf cart lives in the Edgewater Mobile Home Park nearby (1754 South Highway 17). I located a tan golf cart with some front-end damage at Lot 7. I made contact with Robert Rumler at this unit who advised he did strike the hydrant. Robert advised he was driving home in his golf cart on the sidewalk when he observed a couple 'making out' along the side of the road. Robert, advised this distracted him, at which point he crashed into the hydrant. Robert advised he was ejected from the golf cart, but did not suffer any injuries.

I attempted to locate a VIN for the golf cart, but was unable due to the VIN plate being rusted beyond legibility.

Robert did not alert the Sheriff's Office, nor the City of Pomona Park of the crash. Contact was made with Florida Highway Patrol who advised they did not receive any calls from Robert about the incident.

Robert was given a non-criminal uniform traffic citation (AKN8KXE) for Leaving the Scene of a Crash with Property Damage Greater than \$500.00.

This ended my involvement with the incident.

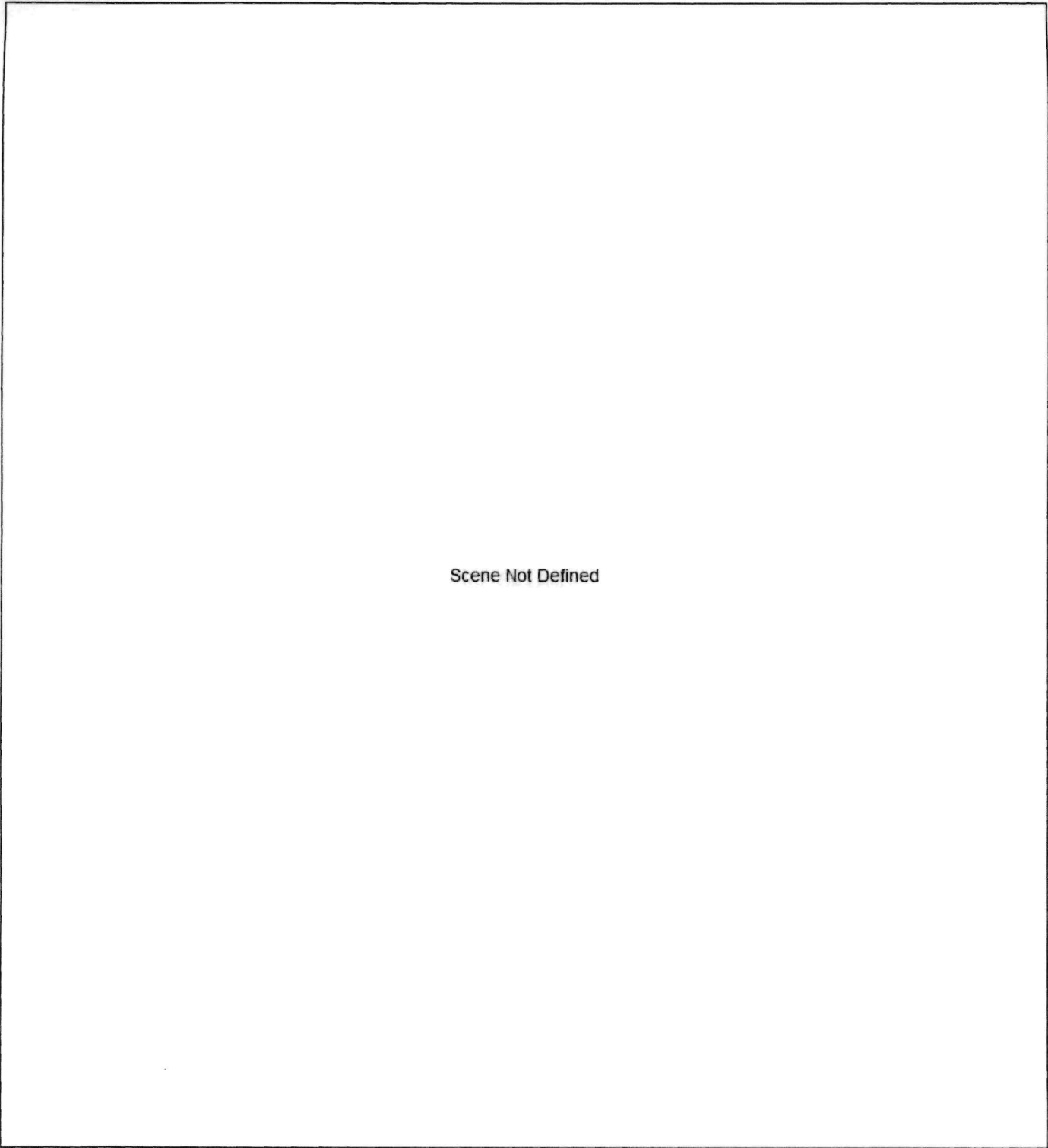

As administrators of the Florida Municipal Insurance Trust (FMIT), the Florida League of Cities, Inc. appreciates the opportunity to be of service to you, and we hope that we have thoroughly met your needs throughout this claims process.

I have completed the investigation of your claim and would like to take this opportunity to explain the basis for FMIT's Claim Payment on the claim, which will soon be mailed to you separately.

FMIT's Property Policy is based upon Replacement Cost Valuation ("RCV") basis, meaning the cost to return your asset to like kind/condition (with some exclusions that are listed specifically in your FMIT policy). 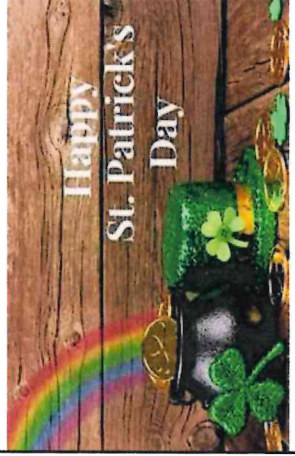
